Dear Willis Families,

Please know that as we approach dismissal time, we are constantly checking weather and if necessary, looking at radar by cell phone, television, and the internet. If we are experiencing light rain with no lightening or thunder, we will proceed with dismissal as usual. Do understand that if it is lightening and thundering, we may delay the dismissal of students until we feel it is safe to do so. Should you desire to change your child's transportation home from a walker or bike rider to car rider due to the weather, you must still call the school and speak to your child's teacher or an adult in the office. If, due to inclement weather, you desire to pick your child up early, it must be done before 2:20 PM. ### **Clinic Notes for April**

Spring is here and along with it has brought quite a few sniffles and itchy eyes. With the warmer weather quickly approaching and things blooming, the pollen count is high and the insects are starting to buzz around and sting. Wasps, hornets and yellow jackets can sting multiple times, as they have a retractable stinger. Honey bees have a barbed type stinger with a venom sac. To remove this

stinger you should swipe a credit card over the area stung. Do not pinch or squeeze where the bite is. Approximately 3% of the population has an allergic reaction to a bee sting. Most people just have a localized reaction, which can have some discomfort for up to a week. Wash area, apply ice and apply an antihistamine cream if necessary.

Don't forget your sunscreen also, as we spend more time in the warmth of the sun. It is said that 80% of sun exposure

occurs before the age of 18. Start good habits of skin care early with routine application of sunscreen with SPF 30 or higher, as recommended by American Academy of Dermatology. Sunburn hurts, so let's help prevent it and help prevent skin cancer.

### Math Lab & Community Service Projects

In the math lab we have been working diligently on Geometric shapes, area, volume, perimeter, and also elapsed time for fifth graders. Kindergarten is working on 2 digit addition, First grade is working on measurement, second, third, and fourth grade are also working on Geometry.

We also have some community projects going on. So far we have recycled 1488 pounds of paper. That equates to 24 trees that we have saved from being cut down. It also has profited Willis Elementary \$30 as the waste management company pays us \$5 for every 250 pounds of paper we recycle. We also have helped keep the school from having a second trash pick-up each week wish saves the district \$4000 per year by removing the paper and plastic from the trash bin. If you happen to be near the math lab look for the graph on the wall showing the current data from our efforts. Soon we will be able to recycle water bottles in the cafeteria during lunch time. We also have placed recycling bins in each grades hallway for plastic bottles, glass and cans.

### **Science**

The third grading period has been very busy in the science lab. The fifth grade has been talking about how force and angle effect the trajectory and distance a rubber band will travel when launched from a rubber band cannon. The students collected, graphed, and analyzed their data collected. The fourth grade has been working on identifying properties of metamorphic, igneous, and sedimentary rocks. We investigated several rock samples for color, streak, cleavage, chemical reaction, luster, and hardness. We've been studying properties of matter in third grade. We've practiced using a balance, graduated cylinder, and thermometer. Second grade has been busy studying human body systems. Your

second grader should have brought home their skeleton picture and is currently working on putting together a paper model of our body systems. Characteristics of living and non living things has been our topic in first grade. We'll also be discussing the difference between wants and needs. Kindergarten has been enjoying our unit on sound by making and playing different instruments while thinking about vibration.

### <u>Art</u>

The fifth graders began a Paper Mache mask project in January, right after winter break. The students eagerly waited to begin this project, only to learn that much time is necessary between steps to complete it. The project turned out to be more of a lesson in patience and determination, rather than just becoming familiar with the process of Paper Mache!

The students learned that the process involves many layers of paste and paint that need time to dry. Certain details on their masks required smaller size brushes, for example, that couldn't be applied until the prior surface had already dried, which in most cases meant waiting a week for the next class. If the students didn't succeed in one or more of the steps, they had to go back and repeat the step/s. After quite a few

trial and errors, the students' efforts have produced wonderful pieces of art. Now that it is April, the masks are in their final stages and the students should be exceptionally proud, as I am, of the results.

Further, we have been in invited to display the masks in a countywide art exhibit at the Manatee Art Center on West Ninth Street. The exhibit will run for a full month in May. It will be a very difficult task to choose just the few for the art exhibit, as each mask came out quite extraordinary.



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### 3rd Grade

Third grade has been busy preparing for Reading and Math FCAT 2.0. We "Expect Success!" on the FCAT and know that our students are well prepared. You can expect to receive your child's scores over the summer break.

After the FCAT, 3rd graders will begin novel studies and applying their reading skills to complete texts. We will also begin some bridge to 4th grade math, including reviewing perimeter and beginning area. As we make the transition to fourth grade it is important that your child continue to read independently for at least 20 minutes a day. Reading stamina is critical in 4th grade, as are independent work habits. Automaticity with multiplication facts will also be important in 4th grade as students begin to multiply and divide larger numbers.

### 4th Grade

Whew ... Fourth Grade has already taken the Florida Writes test in February, but we still working and studying very hard for the upcoming FCAT tests. Now we need your help. We all know that studying and hard work play an important role in how well a student does in school. But there are some basics beyond paying attention in class and doing homework. Fundamentals like good nutrition, plenty of sleep, and enough exercise really matter. These tips will help get children off to a strong start and ready to perform all day. This is especially important with FCAT testing right around the corner. Here are a few other tips:

- ★ Discuss with your child any test review materials that might be sent home.
- ★ Realize that your child may seem more tired than usual after each day of testing.
- ★ Remember to express your support and confidence in your child to do well on FCAT.
- ★ Help your child understand that testing is a part of the instructional process, and there is nothing to be feared.
- ★ Lastly, please make sure your child is here on time and is not absent on the testing days!

With Spring here and as your family's schedule gets more hectic, you might be tempted to cut corners by skipping breakfast, staying up late, and forgetting to get plenty of exercise. But the benefits of these healthy habits will make it all worthwhile, especially during FCAT week. 
