ADMINISTRATIVE TEAM

WELCOME BACK! We are happy to welcome you to the 2014-2015 school year. We are looking forward to a productive partnership with you to ensure our children can achieve their highest potential in a safe environment. We recognize that in order to be successful in school, our children need support from both parents and the school community. We recognize that a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education. As partners, we share the responsibility for our children's safety, particularly during school drop off and pick up.

There are a few key procedures that can make the car drop off and pick up process run more smoothly. First, if you are in the drop off or pick up line, please remain in your vehicle and keep in the right hand lane. Please do not exit your vehicle at any point while in the line. When your vehicle reaches the designated spot, a staff member will assist your child in exiting or entering the vehicle in a safe manner (on the right side of your vehicle). Second, at pick up time be sure to have your lime green name card in a visible location so staff may quickly identify and call your children. Third, PLEASE, do not use your cell phone while driving on school grounds as cell phones can be a distraction while driving. Lastly, in the morning if you wish to drop off your child by parking in the parking lot, please park in a designated space and remember you must escort your child across the crosswalk. Please be sure to use caution while walking through the parking lot.

Another important aspect of safety relates to entering the school building. District policy requires all visitors to sign in at the front office using our computer system. You must first register into the system by providing your drivers license or other photo identification to one of our front office staff. After your name has been entered, you will be able to log on any time you wish to enter the school by typing in your name as it appears on your identification previously provided. After logging in, please notate the reason for your visit and place your name

badge in a visible location on your shirt. Please do not enter the school through any other entrance. Upon leaving the building, please either scan your name badge to indicate that you are checking out, or hand the sticker to one of our front office staff to do so for you.

Following these few procedures will help to ensure the safety of every Willis Elementary student. We greatly appreciate your cooperation and understanding concerning car drop off/pick-up and school sign-in procedures.

HEALTH CLINIC

Health Clinic Notes

WE'RE STARTING A HEALTHY NEW SCHOOL YEAR!

The clinic is up and running! We are here to help take care of our students when they are not feeling well, get hurt, or need medication here at school. We REALLY stress the importance of hand washing and keeping those germs away. Hand sanitizer is a good alternative, but good old soap and water and drying with a paper towel is best.

If your child has a temperature of 100 or above they will be sent home from school and are not to return until they are 24 hours fever free, without the use of a fever reducing medicine. We use clinic passes that the teacher sends down with the student listing their complaint. Any treatment provided is notated on the pass. These notes are sent home as a means of communicating with parents. If the complaint is

a major issue, please know that we will call you. With this said, please make sure we have a correct and current phone number on file at the school.

PLEASE REMEMBER that any medication, even medication that does not require a prescription, MUST have a medication authorization form filled out by a physician and a parent. The parent must then bring the medication AND completed form in to the school clinic to be signed in. These forms are available in the clinic for you to take to your physician should you need them.

Kindergarten

The kindergarten teachers would like to welcome all the kindergarten students and parents to Willis Elementary. We are so excited about this upcoming school year and would like to take this opportunity to give you a glance of what the kindergarten students will be learning.

- ★ In Math, we will start off the school year with counting and cardinality of numbers, followed by adding and subtraction, understanding numbers, geometry, and end the year with measurement and data.
- ★ In Language Arts, we will begin the year with "Building Habits for a Literate Life," and then continue with growing ideas for stories, informational text, details that make topics interesting, how storytellers use details to bring stories to life, how readers and writers take journeys with characters, digging deeper into a topic, and finally immersing ourselves in research to teach others.
- ★ In Science, we will begin the year with thinking like a scientist, followed by objects and materials physical properties, earth and space, energy and motion, sound, and end the year with the study of living things.
- ★ In Social Studies, we will start off the year with "how to be a good citizen," followed with the study of a community, tools of a historian, history (Historical knowledge), and finish the year with geography all around us.

1st Grade

Our first week of school went smoothly and the students are eager to be back. Please remember that establishing routines are as important at school as they are at home. So, please continue to make sure your child is getting to bed early and has a healthy breakfast.

Over the next couple of weeks, the students will be reading both fiction and non-fiction text. They will use the strategy of visualizing to develop comprehension and the skill of finding key details. By digging deeper into the stories, the students will have a better understanding of the central message.

In Math, the students will represent real world situations with objects, mental images and drawings to identify situations involving putting together (adding) or taking apart (subtraction). We will solve addition and subtraction problems for the unknown number in all positions.

2nd Grade

We are so excited to welcome the new second graders and are looking forward to a fantastic year! We would like to give parents a brief overview of the first units of study.

Our first unit in Language Arts is "Friends and Families." We will focus on key details and students will be asked to explain how these key details help us understand the characters. They will also be asked to use text features to better understand nonfiction text. Please read with your child at home, and as you are reading stop and ask questions to help deepen their understanding of the story.

Our first unit in Math focuses on operations and algebraic thinking. Students will be asked to identify groups of numbers as even or odd. They will also fluently add and subtract within 20 using mental strategies. There are lots of games that you can play at home to help your child add and subtract more fluently. You can use dice and ask them to either add or subtract numbers or use playing cards and play "Make a Ten, Go Fish". Please ask your teacher for directions or other suggestions on how to review basic facts.

In addition to Language Arts and Math, we have great units planned for Science and Social Studies. In Science we will be discussing the practice of science and how to think like a scientist. We will also review the scientific method. In Social Studies, we will be discussing citizenship and the ways that we can be good citizens. This unit aligns perfectly with the beginning of the school year.

We are looking forward to another great year. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions about how to better help your child at home.


3rd Grade

Exposing your child to realworld application of math skills is a great way to support them in mathematics.


