## **ADMINISTRATIVE TEAM**

Third quarter is moving right along and everyone is working hard. These days will get even busier as we move into the second half of the school year.

The students and teachers continue to work hard towards mastery of grade level standards. We see this hard work every day as we visit and observe the classrooms. This year 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students will be taking a new assessment, the FSA (Florida Standards Assessment), which will replace the FCAT.

Our 4th and 5th grade students will be taking a <u>writing</u> portion of the FSA on March 3rd. Our 4th and 5th grade teachers have been working hard to implement a new writing curriculum to help our students be successful on the new writing assessment.

Third, fourth and fifth grade students' learning in <u>Reading and Math</u> will also be measured by the FSA. The testing window for 3rd and 4th grade FSA Reading and Math will be March 23rd through March 26th. Our 5th grade students FSA Reading and Math testing window will be April 13th to May 8th.

<u>Science</u> mastery will be assessed in 5th grade using the Science FCAT 2.0. Fifth grade FCAT 2.0 Science assessment will be given on April 20th and 21st.

As students and teachers prepare for the new standardized assessment there are many questions as to how the FSA will compare to the FCAT 2.0. You can learn more about the FSA by visiting FSAassessments.org.

Please ensure that your child receives several good nights of sleep prior to testing dates and during the testing window. Proper sleep and a healthy breakfast can make a difference in your child's performance. Also, be sure that your child arrives at school on time every morning during testing. A stressful morning can be a huge distraction for students. If your child is ill during testing it is best to keep them home, make-up dates are built into the testing window.

We are in need of proctors to assist the teachers while they administer the standardized assessments. Proctors are needed in 3rd-5th grade. If you are interested in proctoring please contact Mrs. Catena at <u>catenak@manateeschools.net</u> or Mrs. Bradford at <u>bradfordc@manateeschools.net</u>.

On another note please remember that supervision for students is not provided prior to 8:00am. We have had an increasing number of students over the last few weeks dropped off before 8:00am. Please do not drop off your children prior to the time we provide supervision. We want our children to continue to be safe and appreciate your help with this. Thank you for all you do to support Willis and for all you do to make Willis a great place to learn!

Here's what we've been doing in the Science Lab the past few weeks ....

Fifth grade worked on the properties of matter and is moving on to measuring force, distance, and the amount of work that is done. Fourth grade has been learning about space by simulating the phases of the moon and the lunar surface. Third grade has started their unit on mass, weight, and volume. Second grade will be moving on to their unit on living things after a brief review of the stars and sun. First grade is starting space while the Kindergarteners explore force and motion.

The students are always excited when they get to see something like a wasp nest, a snake skin, or a bird nest up close. I appreciate your interest in the science lab and look forward to more of these shares. # Kindergarten

We are beginning our third quarter of kindergarten. The kindergarten teachers are amazed at how much the students have grown physically and academically. We are very proud of their accomplishments. We look forward to the second half of the school year. Please help your child be successful by having them practice their reading skills and sight words every night.

In Math, we are finishing up with exploring addition and subtraction of numbers through 10. We will move on to understanding numbers 11-19. During Language Arts, students are learning how storytellers use details to bring stories to life. Science has provided the opportunity to learn about energy and motion. In Social Studies, we will learn how to use and create a timeline.



# **1st Grade**

Our first grade classes attended a wonderful field trip in December to Dakin Dairy Farm. The children enjoyed homemade butter, tasting white and chocolate milk, watching the process of cows being milked, and their favorite part were the pig races.

Our first grade classes will be traveling to Sarasota in January to attend another field trip at Van Wezel Performing Arts Theatre. They will be watching Fly Guy and other amazing stories.

February will have our first graders moving into comparing numbers in Math through greater and lesser than. So many exciting things happening at Willis in First Grade!

## **2nd Grade**

Our second graders have been eager and excited learners this past quarter. We have come to this year's halfway mark. This turns our students from "new second graders" to "almost third graders" and we are ready to dig deeper into our curriculum.

Moving forward with Math, we will be switching gears to money, time, and measurement. Money and time have proven tricky to students in the past, considering the digital age we live in. Some excellent ways to reinforce these skills at home can be as simple as bringing out the piggy banks and analog clocks, plus there must be "an app for that!" These are great units for kids to see real world application first hand. It is important to continue to review addition and subtraction to keep these skills fresh.

In Reading, we will continue analyzing informational texts to identify the main idea by using key details as evidence to prove our thinking. When you are reading with your child at home, you can practice this skill by identifying the main idea of individual paragraphs along with the main idea of the entire text. We will carry this over into our writing, as we write our own informational texts. Students will be required to include text features, such as diagrams and captions, into their own writing.

Our students have really been enjoying receiving all of their fabulous Walk-a-thon prizes! We are looking forward to the upcoming spring book fair, in which all students will receive a \$5 book of their choice for free! This is possible because the teachers voted to donate a portion of their A+ recognition money from the state to the students. We are looking forward to another great quarter and second half of the school year. Thank you for all of your continued support in your child's education.

# **3rd Grade**

Third grade is rolling into the 3rd quarter on all cylinders! We are gaining momentum as we prepare for the FSAs and watch our 3rd graders take off!

Our reading is focusing on a variety of skills from fiction to nonfiction and test-taking strategies. We are also working with words, especially taking a look at some common prefixes, suffixes, and root words. A solid foundation in phonics skills and vocabulary is critical to comprehending complex text. Please make sure your child is putting in some high-quality reading time every day.

Math is steamrolling through fractions and into measurement. The FSA will cover all of the topics addressed in math this year. Review place value, data, and of course multiplication facts to help prepare your child for testing.

We will be visiting Felts Preserve in May to do some bird-watching and see some native Florida wildlife. We are looking forward to to this trip to reward all of our hard work!

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## **5th Grade**

The fifth graders have been very busy in math class. The students have been learning about fractions and gaining a deeper understanding of what fractions are, as well as learning how to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions. They have also been working on test taking strategies, and learning the format of the new Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) test.


In science, students have been learning about force and motion. They also were engaged in a learning experience about our environment and living things in our area. We were lucky enough to go to Coquina Beach in Bradenton to learn about sea creatures with a dip netting activity. We took a nature walk and identified trees and plants. The guides taught the students about creatures found in the estuaries. It was a little chilly, but still a great learning experience.

In reading we have been studying folktales and realistic fiction. We are learning to synthesize information and quote accurately from the text to support their answers. This also connects to our writing program.

An area that parents can help at home is by teaching your child computer keyboarding skills, as some of the end of school exams will be completed on a computer. Examples of things they should know: how to make a capital letter, how to use spell check, how to indent a paragraph, and using the shift and tab keys.

We also ask that you be sure your child comes to class prepared daily with notebook paper, pencils, agenda, homework, as many children are out of paper and pencils, and our classroom supplies are nearly diminished. Thank you for your attention to this matter.
