It's springtime at Willis Elementary and we can't believe there are only a few weeks left before summer begins. The 2015-2016 year has been amazing at Willis thanks to our volunteers, parents, staff, and sponsors. We can't thank you enough for all of your support, time, partnership, and leadership.

I hope that you have been able to enjoy some of our great events we have had so far, such as the Walk-A-Thon, Holiday Shop, Muffins with Mom, Donuts with Dad, various Spirit Nights, the Gecko Gala, and Staff Appreciation week. But don't worry the fun has not ended yet! We still have the Talent Show, Above the Lake, Father/Daughter Dance, and Field Day to come. Yearbooks will be arriving soon too.

The P.T.O. Board would especially like to thank all of our Committee Chairs who volunteered so much of their time, energy, and talents to our children and school. These events, activities, and fundraisers would not be possible without these amazing volunteers. Our fundraising events netted a profit for our school of over \$100,000 this year!

Some highlights of how we used these funds are as follows:

- ★\$16.5K to provide all of the teachers iPads and reading application,
- ★\$5K to fund all of our fabulous community events such as Muffins with Mom, Donuts for Dad, Runner's Club, and Field Day,
- \pm \$4.7K to provide an opportunity for 8 teachers to attend training at the FETC conference,
- ★\$4.2K to supplement the school budget to allow teachers to purchase necessary items for their classrooms,
- ★\$3K for landscaping and maintaining the lawn,
 - ★\$2.6K to provide science equipment,

- ★\$500 to provide playground equipment,
- ★\$30K has been earmarked to mount the remaining projectors, and
- ★\$5K has been earmarked to purchase and mount ceiling fans in our outside gym area.

We are excited to announce that installation has already begun on the P.E. fans! We also look forward to the hearing the year end feedback on the Fountas & Pinnell reading program we purchased for the iPads which was implemented by teachers in the Fall. We continue to work with the district to have the projectors and sound systems mounted. The funds have been set aside and will continue to be earmarked for this purpose.

Going into next year, we are evaluating opportunities to invest money into the library, purchasing a digital sign for the outside, building out a volunteer work area, and other enrichment opportunities for the students. We would love to hear your ideas and welcome you to join our last P.T.O. meeting on Wednesday, May 18th at 6:00pm in the Cafetorium.

We want to thank each Willis family for making this another outstanding school year. We hope that you have a fabulous summer and we look forward to seeing you in August!



May is National Physical Fitness and Sports month!

Did you know that regular physical activity increases your chances of living a longer, healthier life? It also reduces your risk for high blood pressure, heart disease, and some types of cancer. Yet most people don't get the recommended amount of physical activity. The goal is to be physically active at least 1 hour a day and most of our children accomplish this just by playing outside.

However, at this time of year when it is getting hotter and the humidity is rising, we need to remember a few things. Putting on sunscreen before you go outside and reapplying it after swimming or sweating is a must. Wear a hat to help protect your eyes and face from the sun's rays, too. Also, remember to keep hydrated. Water is the best choice for a beverage, but if you are outside for long periods of time you might want to replenish your electrolytes with a Gatorade type of drink in between the water.

Remember water safety and never swim alone. Swimming is fun and great exercise, so stay safe and watch your little ones around water. Swim lessons are offered at many facilities in our area both for young ones and young at heart. Most of all, have a fun and safe summer!

Willis Elementary raised over \$30,000 in donations, making our school one of the top fundraising schools in Florida. The American Heart Association will provide students in 4th and 5th grades valuable Hands Only CPR training this May because of our success in this event.





